The package also included four racquets, a dozen balls, four Go Bananas! drawstring bags, water bottles, hats, sunglasses and wristbands and an assortment of Go Bananas! cards – everything to start a kid on the tennis pathway.

We have also gotten tennis into PE classes in 30 additional schools with 14,000 students in southwestern and eastern central Virginia as part of the Mid-Atlantic Supercharge School Tennis Task Force.
