## **BrightSTARS-Tennis for Me! Begins Third Year at Greer Elementary**

Charlottesville, Virginia (10/24/2016) – QuickStart Tennis of Central Virginia, Inc. (QCV) is pleased to report the third year of BrightSTARS—Tennis for Me! at Greer Elementary School in Albemarle County is underway. This year 36 four-year-olds who participate in the Virginia Preschool Initiative (VPI) program are learning about tennis and nutrition from QCV volunteers. QuickStart Coordinator Lynda Harrill, QCV Board members Linda Perry and Barbara Watson and community volunteers Margaret Rose and Susan Nothnagle are working with the kids with an assist from the preschool teaching assistants. BrightSTARS—Tennis for Me! is a 10-session format taught in October, November, March, April and May. Each session is themed with a different food and the healthy eating message is reinforced by Go Bananas!! bracelets and a variety of Go Bananas! nutrition cards. Kids receive 30 minutes of tennis instruction and nutrition education at each session. QCV created the innovative curriculum. BrightSTARS sessions are held at Greer Elementary on Wednesday mornings.



QCV's service area includes Albemarle, Amelia, Appomattox, Brunswick, Buckingham, Charlotte, Culpeper, Cumberland, Dinwiddie, Fluvanna, Franklin, Greene, Greensville, Halifax, Henry, Louisa, Lunenburg, Madison, Mecklenburg, Nelson, Nottoway, Orange, Patrick, Pittsylvania, Prince Edward, Powhatan and Rappahannock counties and the cities of Charlottesville, Danville and Martinsville, We currently serve 190 schools with 89,000 kids, 13 parks & recreation departments, three Boys & Girls Clubs and two YMCAs in 27 counties and three independent cities. We have also gotten tennis into PE classes in 30 additional schools with 14,000 students in southwestern and eastern central Virginia as part of the Mid-Atlantic Supercharge School Tennis Task Force.
