That is because, for the past eight years, Albemarle County elementary and middle schools have been using child-size, tennis equipment, provided by QuickStart Tennis of Central Virginia, in both their physical education classes and afterschool programs.

In 2009, Quick Start Coordinator and founder, Lynda Harrill, initiated a pilot program at Greer Elementary. Her passion for bringing tennis to school age children has helped grow the program to now serve 205 schools in 27 counties, reaching 94,000 children. Lynda works tirelessly to secure funding for the program and has expanded it beyond tennis by bringing the concept of healthy eating to young tennis enthusiasts.

WHAT IS QUICKSTART TENNIS?

Tennis Associations kid-sized, age-appropriate format for teaching children ages three and up the "sport for a lifetime." Tennis has always taught children valuable character-building life skills like integrity, sportsmanship, dedication, determination and teamwork. QuickStart has changed the teaching approach from traditional instruction to "play to learn" with a competency progression, which helps children experience success early on. QuickStart (QCV) adds FUN, fitness and conditioning activities that work on agility, balance, coordination, footwork and reaction time. QCV is helping create "play pathways" in the communities we serve to get kids playing tennis in physical education classes, after-school and out-of-school. Children have so much FUN with QuickStart that they don't even know they're learning - and they are learning a lot. QuickStart strives to bring out the best in children naturally.

QCV is an all-volunteer, 501(c)3, grassroots, Community Tennis Association (CTA) dedicated to promoting, developing and growing QuickStartTennis in 27 counties and three independent cities in central Virginia.
