(QCV) is pleased to report we participated in the annual Family Fitness Night at Thomas Jefferson Elementary School in Louisa County for the fourth year in a row. The event is organized each year by PE teacher Leslie Simpson. Over the 90 minutes, more than 130 students and parents played tennis in the gym. We had a large group of kids five and under, so we depended on parents to help us teach kids the ABCs (agility, balance and coordination) of tennis. We also had long lines with people waiting to jump "on court" but we made sure we got them all in.







QuickStart Tennis Coordinator Lynda Harrill says, "We absolutely love supporting Family Fitness Night at Thomas Jefferson Elementary. It's a terrific tradition. This year was the best ever. We were so busy, no one could take a break. We have also gotten tennis into PE classes in 30 additional schools with 14,000 students in southwestern and eastern central Virginia as part of the Mid-Atlantic Supercharge School Tennis Task Force.
