Vivi Hui is now ranked #1 in Girls 10 and under in the Mid-Atlantic Section. She recently finished her 10 and under career as a singles finalist in the 10U Mid-Atlantic Section Championship in Haymarket. She then won the Section doubles title with Setareh Mahjoob from Rockville, MD, who is ranked #3 in the Section. Nine-year-old Vivi is a rising fifth-grader at Cale Elementary and played in her first tournament in December 2013.



Vivi is pictured with her coach Christopher Cubbage, USPTA and USTA/Virginia Teaching Professional of the Year for 2014, at a recent junior tournament at the Boar's Head Sports Club where she won the Girls 12 and Under Singles title. Vivi has been "playing up" in the 12Us since last September. She now ranks #42 in the Girls 12 and under in the Mid-Atlantic Section and boasts a 16-5 record with three 12U titles. She has also played in a couple of 14 and under tournaments.
