The team is coached by Ellen Markowitz, PhD., founder of SuperStarters Sports and Director of Tennis for Albemarle County Parks & Recreation.



Ellen says, "I have wanted to join the JJTL for a few years, and thought this would be a good year for it. We now have a number of kids who are 8-11 years old and have progressed to the point of not only wanting to compete, but also being ready for match play in their strokes and attitudes. Even if not every team has 10 & under players week to week, it's a chance for the team to have regular practice time,

and learn by playing each other. They are always smiling and having fun together on the court, which is a joy to see!"

"This is their first experience on a tennis team, and they are learning so much every week! It's really exciting to see them grow and improve in their tennis. Last week we went to Farmington, where most of the kids stepped on a clay court for the first time! At the end of the day, when I asked them what they learned, responses were about keeping score correctly, how to say the score right, serves getting better, being ready for the ball, and other great answers!"

QCV QuickStart Coordinator Lynda Harrill says, "A new public-based team like this gives non-club kids the opportunity to compete in a supportive, team atmosphere

against established club teams. Dr. E is taking her students to the next level, and from the smiles in the photo, it looks like everyone is enjoying the new experience."

We have also gotten tennis into PE classes in 30 additional schools with 14,000 students in southwestern and eastern central Virginia as part of the Mid-Atlantic Supercharge School Tennis Task Force.
