A two-day camp will be held August 20-21, just before school starts for Albemarle County.

QuickStart programming at Crozet Park for September and October will be previewed at a FREE QuickStart Tennis Festival (on-court FUN, games and prizes) on August 25 from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m. Dr. E and fellow pro Chris “Cubby” Cabbage of Matilda Blue Tennis, who both will run fall programs at the Park, will be there to coordinate the QuickStart FUN.
