

## BrightSTARS Receives Grant from QuickStart Tennis Fund in the Charlottesville Area Community Foundation

**Charlottesville, Virginia** (12/14/2017) – QuickStart Tennis of Central Virginia, Inc. (QCV) is pleased to report we have received a grant from the QuickStart Tennis Fund in the Charlottesville Area Community Foundation. The grant will be used for Go Bananas! t-shirts for 140 preschoolers in five schools in Albemarle County where community volunteers teach the BrightSTARS–Tennis for Me! curriculum. BrightSTARS is a tennis and nutrition immersion format developed specifically for four-year-olds in preschool programs for disadvantaged and at-risk kids at Agnor-Hurt, Cale, Greer, Stone-Robinson and Woodbrook elementary schools.

The kids will take the shirts home at the end of the school year and hopefully get several more years of wear out of them. 


QuickStart Tennis of Central Virginia is an all-volunteer, grassroots Community Tennis Association established in 2009 as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization to promote, develop and grow QuickStart Tennis in the heart of Virginia for all beginners, especially underserved youth, using the kid-sized QuickStart Tennis format.

QCV's service area includes Albemarle, Amelia, Appomattox, Brunswick, Buckingham, Charlotte, Culpeper, Cumberland, Dinwiddie, Fluvanna, Franklin, Greene, Greensville, Halifax, Henry, Louisa, Lunenburg, Madison, Mecklenburg, Nelson, Nottoway, Orange, Patrick, Pittsylvania, Prince Edward, Powhatan and Rappahannock counties and the cities of Charlottesville, Danville and Martinsville. We currently serve 207 schools with more than 95,000 kids, 15 parks & recreation departments, three Boys & Girls Clubs and two YMCAs in 27 counties and three independent cities. We have also gotten tennis into PE classes in 30 additional schools with 14,000 students in southwestern and eastern central Virginia as part of the Mid-Atlantic Supercharge School Tennis Task Force.
