Racquets for Reading!!! Kids in Nelson County - May 2022

QuickStart Tennis of Central Virginia, Inc. (QCV), a Section 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization, operates as a special-purpose Community Tennis Association (CTA) focused on QuickStart Tennis, the USTA's kid-sized format developed for kids 10 and under. The format is also adaptable for beginners of any age and players who feel less comfortable covering a full-size court. QCV promotes, develops and grows QuickStart Tennis in 28 counties (with the addition of Campbell County in October 2021) and three independent cities in central and southside Virginia. QCV uses tennis as a vehicle to create happy, healthy, active and literate kids in the communities it serves and enrich their lives through tennis.

QCV named 2021 CTA of the Year by *Racquet Sports Industry* magazine

We were honored to be named the Community Tennis Association of the Year and a 2021 Champion of Tennis by *Racquets Sport Industry* (RSI) magazine in January 2022. This honor recognizes "the dedicated people, organizations and companies who continue to work tirelessly to better this industry and this sport." RSI observed, "When COVID hit, QCV quickly realized the challenges it presented when it comes to access to healthy activity, nutrition and education, so it launched **Racquets for Reading!!!** which paired tennis with literacy and nutrition. A goal was to build 'home libraries' for kids to improve reading skills and scores and to build awareness for nutrition." (There are more than 800 CTAs in the country.)

Literacy and healthy eating . . .

Playing tennis with kids in school was not possible again this past school year due to restrictions on volunteers in schools, so we emphasized our **Racquets for Reading!!!** (RFR) initiative, which builds "home libraries" for preschoolers and kindergartners. Through RFR we make grants to schools for classroom teachers to select and purchase "bargain" books from Scholastic Book Club, promote healthy eating with our **Go Bananas for QuickStart!** cards and provide FUN giveaways to engage kids and foster a love of reading. Since inception in November 2020, RFR has reached 6,400 kids in 24 school systems through the end of the 2021/2022 school year.

Building a "reading pathway" ...

Further research into the reading scores in QCV's service area indicates kids need books in their hands before they enter preschool. Child development research suggests the first three years of life are particularly critical to the acquisition of vocabulary and pre-reading skills. Dolly Parton's Imagination Library (DPIL), a 27-year-old, turnkey book-gifting program for kids from birth until they turn five, presented the solution. For \$25.20 per year (funded by community donors), a child receives an age-appropriate book each month mailed to their home at no cost to the family.

DPIL perfectly complements what QCV aims to accomplish with **Racquets for Reading!!!**. Together these two programs form a "reading pathway" from birth through kindergarten. We want all kids to read at grade level by the end of kindergarten. As Dolly Parton says, "You can never get enough books into the hands of enough children." Since April 2021, we have started or expanded DPIL programs in eight of our counties. More than 2,400 kids are now enrolled in these new programs. We are working to have a DPIL program that covers every one of our 31 school-system partners.

Eleven states and the District of Columbia currently support DPIL by funding some or all of the costs of the program. In January 2022, a member of the Virginia House of Delegates submitted a Budget Amendment to have the Commonwealth fund 50% of the costs and take DPIL statewide. The House approved the Amendment as submitted and the award was included in the Budget signed by the Governor in June 2022. This financial support will enable under-resourced communities all over Virginia to provide access to books for their youngest citizens. The local-community DPIL affiliate will need to raise only \$12.60 per child annually.



About 25% of kids who don't read at grade level by the end of third grade drop out of school. Kids who don't read at grade level at the end of kindergarten likely will not make the third-grade benchmark. Getting to kids early is essential. Kids in low-income situations have only one ageappropriate book for every 300 kids. Kids need "home libraries" to develop vocabulary and acquire reading skills. This is a deeply rooted, socioeconomic problem that can be helped by getting books into kids' hands with the "reading pathway" provided by DPIL and RFR.

A partial return to "normalcy"

With the easing of some COVID restrictions and the return to in-person teaching in schools, QCV was able to resume some "normal activities." We trained the preschool teachers in Louisa County to run our **BrightSTARS-Tennis for Me!** tennisand nutrition-immersion format in their Virginia Preschool Initiative classrooms.



Later in the school year, we held a training session for all PE teachers in Louisa County.



Jump Start QuickStart Tennis, QCV's first initiative, introduced QuickStart Tennis into schools, parks & recreation programs and other youth-based organizations in underserved, rural communities. In October 2021, we were pleased to welcome Campbell County into our service area, in our first area expansion since 2014. Campbell County has seven elementary schools with 3,600 students.

As of August 31, 2022, QCV has taken tennis to 214 schools in its service area, making it possible for over 101,000 kids to learn to play in school and afterschool QuickStart Tennis programs.


Since beginning *Jump Start QuickStart* in 2009, QCV has exposed more than 170,000 kids in its service area to tennis.

QCV has also taken tennis to 37 schools with 16,000 students outside its service area, for a total of 251 schools with 117,000+ students.

QCV's Go Bananas for QuickStart! campaign, which uses tennis players as nutritional and lifeskills role models for kids, has reached more than 27,000 kids since 2009. Pre-COVID, QCV took the Go Bananas! message to physical education classes, family fitness nights, fun fairs, back-toschool nights, afterschool QuickStart Tennis programs, summer camps, preschool programs and community events like Junior Leagues' Kids in the Kitchen. QCV's goal to improve the physical and nutritional literacy of the kids it serves has expanded over the years to include healthy personal habits and life skills. In fiscal year 2022, given the ongoing COVID challenges, we continued to incorporate Go Bananas! into Racquets for Reading !!! and reached 4,000+ kids.



We did get to participate in Madison County's inaugural Back-to-School Blast in August 2022, where we promoted **Go Bananas!**, **BrightSTARS-Tennis for Me!** and the "reading pathway" formed by Dolly Parton's Imagination Library and **Racquets for Reading!!!**.



QuickSTARS shine . . .

QuickSTARS are kids who started playing tennis using the kid-sized QuickStart format and have gone on to compete in tournaments at state, national and international levels. This past year, two of our QuickStart "veteran" kids, Ilyas Fahim and Blythe Sturman, stood out, so we stepped up to support them with stipends to cover tournament entry fees.

- QuickStart Tennis of Central Virginia, Inc. ("QCV") is a tax-exempt charitable organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. QCV's mission is to promote, develop and grow QuickStart Tennis in 28 counties and three independent cities in central and southside Virginia.
- 2. QCV maintains its books on the cash basis of accounting on a fiscal year ending each August 31.
- 3. QCV has no tangible assets other than cash derived primarily from grants, sponsorships and other sources of public support. Administrative expenses are funded through donations from public donors.
- 4. As of August 31, 2022, QCV had cash of \$43,674 of which \$30,400 is committed to future QuickStart Tennis grants and program activities according to the terms of the respective grants and sponsorships. QCV had no other significant commitments or payables as of August 31, 2022.
