Little Joe Chickapig and QCV Support Preschoolers during COVID-19

Charlottesville, Virginia (8/19/2020) – QuickStart Tennis of Central Virginia, Inc. (QCV) is pleased to report we have received a donation of *Little Joe Chickapig* books for 222 preschoolers in Albemarle County as part of the new *Racquets for Reading!!!* initiative we created in response to COVID-19. The books were generously donated by Brian Calhoun, author of the book and creator of the Chickapig board game. Even though COVID-19 prevents us from working with these kids in the classroom, we can still promote healthy eating and life skills through our *Go Bananas for QuickStart!* campaign and foster a love of reading by giving them books to keep. Having age-appropriate books in the home is the number one factor in developing reading skills early in life. Kids who participate in Albemarle County's Bright Stars preschool program are disadvantaged and at-risk, and they will be disproportionately affected by the disruption of education by COVID-19 without some additional support. That is why we are stepping up and reaching out into the community for benefactors like Brian Calhoun of Chickapig to help us enrich these kids' lives.

The *Little Joe Chickapig* books will be distributed to the kids during home visits over the next three weeks by preschool teachers and family coordinators. Kids will also be able to read along with Brian's *Little Joe Chickapig* video.



Brian says, "It gives me great joy to donate copies of *Little Joe Chickapig* to the Bright Stars Program. This is a book about following dreams. I grew up admiring so many people around me and drawing inspiration from those who were pursuing their passions. I hope this book can relay that message and inspire a few Bright Stars."

We currently serve 212 schools with 99,000 kids, 15 parks & recreation departments, three Boys & Girls Clubs and two YMCAs in 27 counties and three independent cities. We have also gotten tennis into PE classes in 37 additional schools with 16,000 students in communities outside our service area.
