QCV's Racquets for Reading!!! Counteracts COVID Challenges

Charlottesville, Virginia (1/11/2021) – QuickStart Tennis of Central Virginia, Inc. (QCV) is pleased to report on the progress of its Racquets for Reading!!! initiative. Racquets for Reading!!! was originally intended for disadvantaged and at-risk preschoolers and kindergartners in Albemarle County as a response to COVID-19 and our resulting inability to work with those kids in-person. Last October, we decided to expand our scope and raise funds for books, Go Bananas for QuickStart! materials and FUN giveaways (reading rubber duckies, banana-scented bookmarks, etc.) to many more kids in our 27-county Service Area (total so far: 2,940 kids in 16 school systems).

Books grants and giveaways funded so far (765 kids):

- Albemarle County 190 preschoolers and 90 kindergartners
- Appomattox 70 preschoolers
- Cumberland 70 preschoolers
- Greene —30 preschoolers and 100 kindergartners
- Madison 50 preschoolers
- Martinsville 80 preschoolers
- Patrick 85 preschoolers

Grant requests have been filed and are pending for (1,260 kids):


- Buckingham 80 preschoolers
- Culpeper 90 preschoolers and 250 kindergartners (in three Title I schools)
- Cumberland 80 kindergartners
- Franklin 260 preschoolers
- Greene 80 kindergartners
- Louisa 130 preschoolers
- Nelson 20 preschoolers and 90 kindergartners
- Pittsylvania 270 preschoolers

Grant requests in process to be filed (915 kids), with more to come:

- Brunswick 40 preschoolers and 100 kindergartners
- Danville 145 preschoolers and 420 kindergartners
- Greensville 90 preschoolers and 120 kindergartners

QCV QuickStart Coordinator Lynda Harrill says, "It's been a crazy few months digging into the school readiness data and reading scores of elementary schools in our Service Area, talking to school administrators and teachers and writing grant requests at a pace I've never done before. Getting age-appropriate books in the hands of a disadvantaged and at-risk kids is a wonderful thing to do at any time, but it's especially important during this crisis.

"Here's why we needed to step up (see map). Our Service Area has lots of red and orange (very low) counties and individual schools within yellow and light green (still too low) counties that could use a boost. Research shows kids who don't read at grade level at the end of third grade are going to struggle for the rest of their time in school and many will drop out. We can help prevent that with early intervention, books for kids to keep and some Go Bananas for QuickStart! FUN."

We have also gotten tennis into PE classes in 37 additional schools with 16,000 students in communities outside our service area.
