Brendan is a Tennis Recruiting Network Blue Chip Recruit, ranked #1 in Arkansas, #5 in the Gulf States region and #57 nationally. He recently won a bronze ball in Doubles at the USTA Boys 18s National Championships. He is ranked #1 in Arkansas, #8 in the USTA Southern Section and #41 nationally by the U.S. Tennis Association.

Lynda Harrill, QCV Founder, says, "Brendan, the son of Becky and Brian Boland, was born and raised in Charlottesville. I take full credit for getting Brendan and his siblings interested in tennis through the kid-sized QuickStart Tennis format. That led to a lot of driveway tennis and canvassing the local neighborhood for tennis partners.
