## **QuickStart Tennis Partners with Soho Center for Greer Elementary**

Charlottesville, Virginia (12/4/2020) – QuickStart Tennis of Central Virginia, Inc. (QCV) is thrilled to announce another collaboration with Soho Center – Read Every Day! (RED!) for Littles. This pilot program will provide a selection of board books from Priddy Books, such as First 100 Words, At the Zoo, At the Farm, Baby Animals, for all 75 kindergartners at Greer ES to read with their younger siblings, cousins and neighbors. The pilot's goal is to improve the reading skills of the kindergartners while encouraging even younger kids to learn to read, so they will be eager to attend school in the near future.

QCV QuickStart Coordinator Lynda Harrill says, "We are so grateful for the generosity of Soho Center and their support of QuickStart Tennis and Greer Elementary, our very first tennis school back in 2008. Kindergartners at Greer and five other Title I schools in Albemarle County recently received 10 age-appropriate books from Soho Center. Jeanna called me last week

about an idea she had to leverage the excitement the kids had about those books into a learning experience for non-school-age siblings at home. (Greer immediately came to mind. We have piloted all sorts of campaigns, initiatives and programs at Greer over the years, and most of the kindergartners at Greer do have younger brothers and sisters.) That's all she had to say and I was on it.

A week later we met at Greer to deliver the books. I brought along the Go Bananas! card 'WHY do tennis players practice kindness?' to distribute to the kids. Giving someone the gift of reading is one of the kindest things anyone can do. Tennis is a lifetime sport. Reading is a lifetime skill. Add healthy eating and we've got the recipe to create happy, healthy, active and educated kids in the communities we serve."

We currently serve 212 schools with 99,000 kids, 15 parks & recreation departments, three Boys & Girls Clubs and two YMCAs in 27 counties and three independent cities. We have also gotten tennis into PE classes in 37 additional schools with 16,000 students in communities outside our service area.
